MEDICATION AND MONITORING FOR PRIVATE ADHD MANAGEMENT NO LONGER PROVIDED

'From July 1, 2024, Lothian GP practices will no longer manage shared-care medications or specialist monitoring for patients diagnosed in the private sector, including ADHD, gender incongruence, severe acne, and post-bariatric surgery care.'

'Private providers must handle prescriptions or investigations beyond GP competencies, as NHS GPs cannot accommodate these due to capacity issues and funding constraints.'
